Pastel works on paper

A short stretch of a pandanuslined creek somewhere near Darwin changes continuously from empty, sun-baked, pink sand to a monsoonal torrent, teeming with water plants, frogs and fish and the occasional glimpse of other visiting animals and birds. Each month. each day, each moment is different.

Working on location, in the sun and the rain, local artist Alison Worsnop records in her pastel sketches and studies, the seasonal cycle of this fascinating, but harsh and transient world.

Haywire Australiana

Haywire from Humpty Doo presents a selection of their sculptured art and Australiana, made from old, abandoned objects, seasoned by the harsh. Top End climate and found in the bush. Jane Hanak and Peter (Roach) Wyatt have made humourous, reconstructed metal sculpture and Mark Hanak has hand-crafted charming, rustic Australian bush furniture.



Blind Date is an exciting project that aims to develop collaborative relationships between emerging artists and Artist Run Institutions around the Territory. Blind Date consists of three stages:

- 1. Artists were 'paired up' from different regions in the NT and began communication;
- 2. In May, the artists met their 'dates' face to face in Tennant Creek;
- 3. Now is the final stage when the completed collaborative art works are exhibited – first in Darwin, then touring to Katherine, Tennant Creek and Alice Springs.



Julie Milton

Through her playful installation of Magpie geese as windsocks, Milton comments on Darwin's transient population and a style of life which is dictated by the weather; it is either a hive of activity or it is inert.
